### **MEET REPORT: Bois-de-Liesse Nature Park – May 15, 2011**

**A**fter five years of O-meets—without rain—we finally got caught. (Perhaps some may still remember the Street-O in Pierrefonds back on April 23, 2006?) This time it was *only* ‘light rain’ that dampened the run for the 58 people who took part. Thankfully, it had stopped by the time we went to pick up the 30 flags.

Because of the restrictions imposed by the park, we were again obliged to place our controls “on trails”. There were a few exceptions, primarily in a section of woods outside the park boundary that were used on the two longer courses. Fortunately, the park has a lot of inter-connecting trails and side paths, allowing for some route choice options.

To add a little extra challenge to those more experienced Orienteers running on the LONG course, control descriptions and flag codes were not given. The correct controls on that course had to be found solely by careful reading of the map. After all, there were strong enough features to judge one’s position by, and flags were set at least 90 meters apart. Even so, a few people did mispunch at a wrong control.

On the other hand, it was encouraging to note that there was no mispunching on the other two courses where descriptions and codes were provided. Too often in the past mispunches occur because of a failure to compare the codes provided with the map and those on the flags in the woods.

Three courses were set. The 10.2 km (probable-best-route distance), took **Francis Falardeau** just 54:36 to run. **Ralph Seifert** and **Nicolas Barrière** placed 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> on the LONG, with times of 1:09:16 and 1:09:32, respectively.

In the MIDDLE distance, 6.16 km event, **Christian Reid** was a clear winner with a time of 0:41:28. 2<sup>nd</sup> place, however, was an exact tie. **Doug Balmer** and **Andreas Rutkauskas** each came back in 0:45:45. The top woman on the course was **Jessica Auer**. She covered the 17 controls in 1:02:00.

The SHORT 3km course had the fewest participants. There were only 5 “starts” comprising 8 adults and five young children. **Mary Ellen Montague** edged **Penny Fulleringer** for the least amount of time spent under the rain (41 vs 48 minutes).

**CONGRATULATIONS to all who came out to the event ... and to all who did well.**

**Special THANKS** are reserved for **Elaine and Bruce**, who hung the flags on the west side of the creek early on Sunday morning...and picked them up after the meet. They also helped with Registration and Timing ...before running the first half of the #3 course.
