MEET REPORT: Maisonneuve Park – October 5, 2013

This event was planned as a re-run of the one we did on May 26...when it poured rain and we were left with a lot of unused maps! Courses 1 and 2 were unchanged from those set on the 26th but no.3 was redesigned—a favour to Orienteers who ran the long course at the earlier meet, and might come again. The switch to a Saturday was necessitated by the CIBC *Run for the Cure* which was scheduled for the park on Sunday.

Almost all who came to Maisonneuve Park on this pleasant and mostly sunny Autumn day ran the #2 course, with a majority continuing to do the #3, for a total of 8.0 km (direct-route measurement).

Francis Falardeau, consistent with his unfailing reputation, covered the 8 kms (29 controls) in a speedy 0:43:18, while **Dmitri Golovanov** was hot on his heels—just 02:12 behind. **Emmanuel Bach**, who is new to Orienteering here but has previous experience in Europe, came third in 0:46:16. **Yulia Klochko** and **Jessica Auer** were the top ladies on the course and returned in just a little over an hour ...only two minutes apart from each other.

Nicolas Barrière, the proud and obviously fit, father of three youngsters, 5, 4 & 2 years of age, ran the #2 course while pushing a carriage with his 3 little ones aboard. Despite the obvious extra burden he still sped around the 4 km #2 in a fast 0:27:59. (‘Makes us wonder who was holding the map & compass and giving directions! Perhaps a future Junior champion? Later, Nicolas and the kids completed an untimed run on the #3 course.

Alexandre Gallant placed 2nd on the #2 in 0:29:49. **Maia Iotzova** was 3rd — and was also “best lady” on the course with a time of 0:42:33.

There were only 3 ‘starts’ on the 3 km Short Course, all family groups.

Jennifer O’Connell, accompanied by son **David** (8), led the way, covering the 17 controls in a quick 0:31:21.

The 34 punches and tapes that were used were set late Friday afternoon by Elaine and myself and checked on Saturday before the start by Bruce. Sylvie Perrault, Francis and I had them all picked up before 3 pm. Gloria handled registration and checked punch cards afterwards.
