15th Annual Mount-Royal Score-O — November 3, 2013

This annual event, with its mass start and 2-hour-maximum format, has become a favourite amongst local Orienteers. Once again the start was at the grand chalet by the Lookout, atop Mount Royal. The weather was sunny but cool – about 1 to 3°C.

Bruce Glen designed the course layout and on Saturday afternoon—with Elaine’s help—put in place the 40 controls and punches. Their location was marked on everyone’s map. The aim for participants was to find as many as possible within the 120-minute limit. Unlike in previous years, all controls were worth 10 points. Returning late would cost 10 points per minute over the limit! Most kept an eye on their watches and few had to pay this penalty.

A lot of careful map reading and smart route choice selections were needed to make a good score. Competitors were given two minutes prior to “the start” in which to study their map and make crucial route-choice decisions. At exactly 10:01 a.m. the start whistle was blown. Everyone dashed off in all directions and the plaza was soon nearly deserted.

At 1:20:56 into the race **Vincent Vionnet** appeared back at the finish, his score-card fully filled. We had a winner! **Francis Falardeau**, last year’s champ, was the second to return in 1:25:28 and before the 2-hours were up 10 more successful Orienteers were in! The next four were: **Dmitri Golovanov, Thomas Kneubühler, Andreas Rutkauskas and Philippe Côté-Jacques.**

Meanwhile, a record was set amongst women O-runners. For the first time at one of our Score-O’s, a female Orienteer – **Aurore Varela** – had gotten to every point. Unfortunately, she was one minute late, leaving her with a 390-points total. **Sarah Wilson** was second (380 pts.) and Vermont’s **Mary Jo Childs** was 3rd (360 pts.)

In addition to the Individual classes there were 30 teams and family groups who took part in the **Teams division**. Leading amongst them: **Stéphane Côté & Thomas Gaffié** (360 pts.) and the **Glen Wight & Susie** team (330 pts.)

Taking part also were 29 students from Karen Oljemark’s Outdoor Education class at John Abbott College. Their top scorer, **Céleste Pilon**, earned 260 pts. Six students from Cegep de Victoriaville all did very well – the swiftest recording 300 pts.

At 233 meters (764 ft.) our Mount Royal is a modest summit as mountains go. But for Orienteering it’s a classic locale. With a multitude of intricately mapped trails – some major, others less-distinct – it can provide a lot of tricky route-choice decisions and require plenty of physical effort. All participants can be justifiably proud of their efforts.
